## REQUEST OF THE BUREAU:

Cleveland recommends that representatives of EAU and INTD/CI-lA effect a liaison with USDJ Office of Special Investigations in an effort to determine the origin of accusatory letters forwarded to USDJ identifying certain emigres as having been Nazi war criminals. Such liaison should include efforts to compare handwriting and fingerprints on "anonymous" letters and to obtain either originals or copies of Soviet documents introduced as "evidence" of such allegations and at least to broach this possibility in an attempt to prevent the USDJ from becoming a tool of the KGB.

It should be noted that one Federal Judge in New Jersey threw a similar case out of court when the Soviet KGB officer presenting his documentary evidence refused to allow the document to be introduced into evidence.

No further investigation of this matter is anticipated at Cleveland, UACB.
